**K-12 ITALIAN LANGUAGE GRANTS
2020-2021 SCHOOL YEAR
GRANT APPLICATION PERIOD: DECEMBER 1, 2019 TO FEBRUARY 15, 2020**

Italian government funded grants are available through Fondazione Italia to K-12 schools throughout CA, NV, AZ and NM. These grants are offered in an effort to promote and support the teaching of the Italian language and culture in schools outside of Italy.

Who can apply?

Public and private not-for-profit K-12 schools throughout CA, NV, AZ and NM offering or intending to offer Italian during the school day, or as an elective course in the 2020-2021 school year. Please note that a grant cannot be awarded for fee-based after-school programs.

What can the funds be used for?

Grant funds may be applied towards the Italian teacher or teaching assistant pay, the purchase of Italian books/didactic materials needed and/or the purchase of hardware and software that will be used to deliver Italian language instruction.

What is the application process?

Submit the application form to Fondazione Italia by **February 15, 2020**

What is the approval process?

A grant review committee composed of representatives from Fondazione Italia and the Consulate of Italy will review each application on a case-by-case basis. A degree of financial participation by the school is expected, especially if you are a continuing school. Funding will only be given to schools that offer Italian to their students during the school day or as an elective class. Grant amounts vary and are subject to availability of funds from the government of Italy. The review committee reserves the right to award the grants at their discretion.

When will I know if I received the grant?

We will try to advise schools of their grant award no later than May 31, 2020.

What is Proof of Payment?

Grant recipient schools are required to submit proof that they spent their grant funds to support their Italian programs no later than December 31, 2020. Fondazione Italia is required to submit this information to the government of Italy to show that the funds were used in compliance with the terms of the grant.

Should the number of hours of actual classroom instruction diminish after disbursement of the grant, the school will be required to reimburse Fondazione Italia accordingly within 60 days of termination of classes. The grant funds cannot be used to cover any other school costs related to the program including but not limited to the cost of benefits, travel or administrative time, insurance etc.

Fondazione Italia is also required to justify the use of the grant funds to the government of Italy by collecting information about the programs from the teachers. Teachers teaching in Italian-government-supported programs are asked to submit to the Italian Consulate and Fondazione Italia a class journal. Fondazione Italia will provide the format for this report.
